THE WORLD BANK INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

PROGRAM DETAILS



Am I eligible to participate?

The Bank Internship is open to students who are nationals of the Bank's member countries and attracts a large number of highly qualified candidates. To be considered for an internship, applicants must:

- Already hold an undergraduate degree
- Be currently enrolled in a full-time Master's or PhD program
- Plan on returning to school in a full-time capacity
- Be fluent in English

How do I apply?

The Bank Internship is offered for two separate sessions annually:

- **Summer (June-September)**
The application period for the summer program is Dec. 1-Jan. 31 each year
- **Winter (December-March)**
The application period for the winter program is Sept. 1-Oct. 31 each year

Interested candidates should apply online. Only candidates selected for an internship will be contacted. Final decisions are made by the hiring Manager on a highly competitive basis.

We typically seek students specializing in areas relevant to the World Bank's operations such as economics, finance, human development (public health, education, nutrition, and population), social sciences (anthropology, sociology), agriculture, environment, private sector development, as well as other related fields. There is no age restriction for the Internship, but participants must be enrolled in a current graduate study program.

The Bank benefits by getting extra assistance from knowledgeable students who bring a diversity of ideas from around the world. Students benefit by forming valuable personal and professional relationships that could last a lifetime.

ABOUT THE APPOINTMENT

Internships are at minimum four weeks and at maximum three months. Contracts may not be extended beyond the internship assignment. The Bank pays an hourly salary to all interns and, where applicable, provides an allowance towards travel expenses. Interns are responsible for their own living accommodations. Most positions are located in Washington, D.C., though some positions are offered in country offices.
